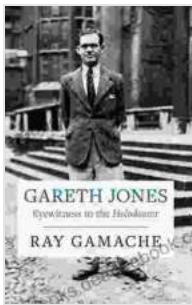

Early life and career

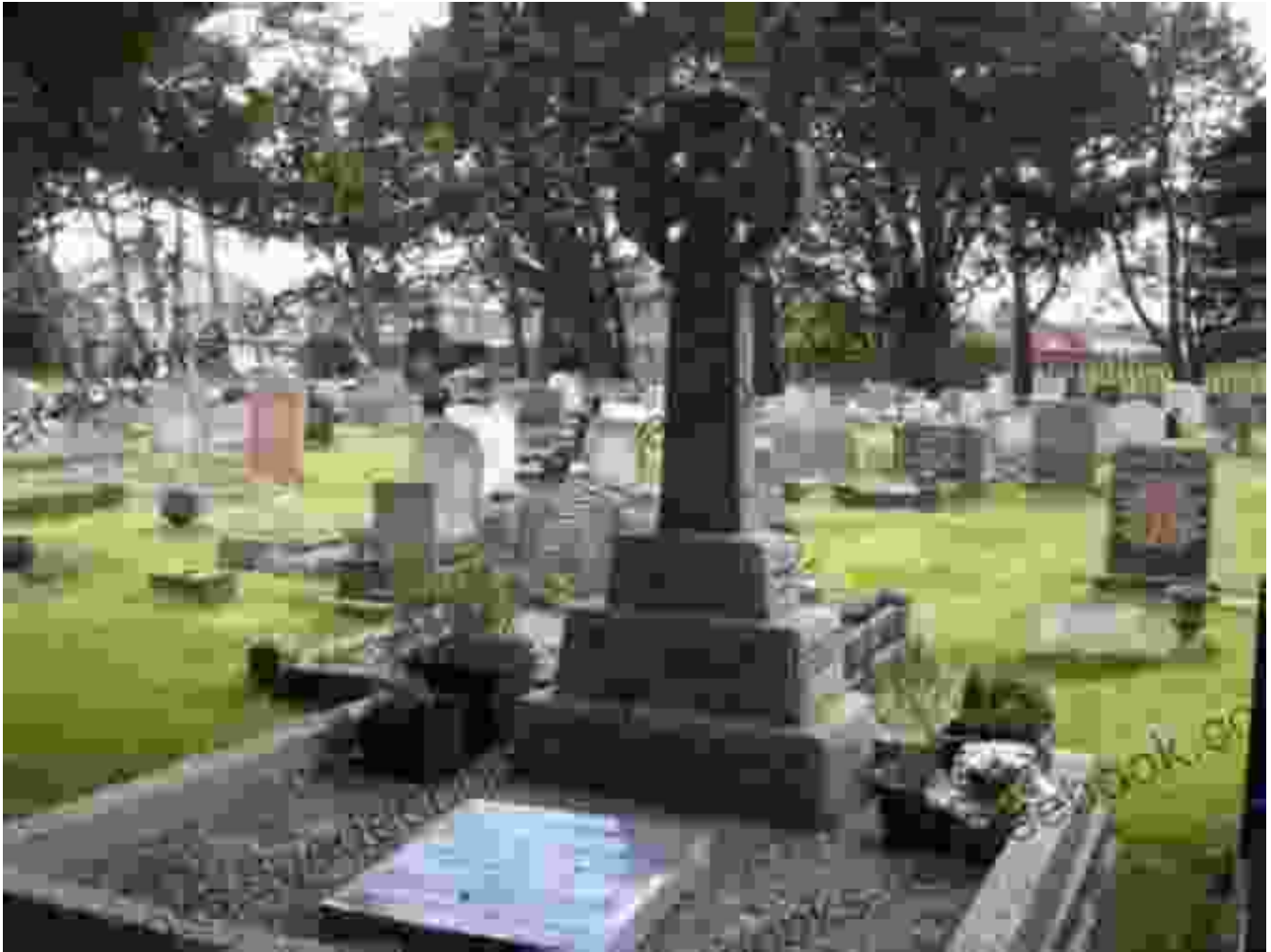

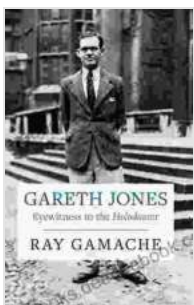

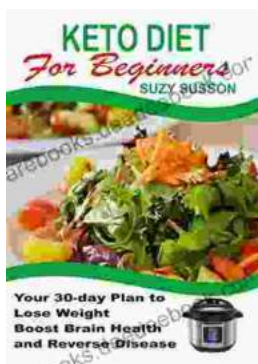
