1. The Narrows, Zion National Park, Utah

The Virgin River flows through the narrow passage, creating a unique and challenging experience. Be prepared to get wet as you wade through the water, but the stunning scenery is well worth it.

2. Angels Landing, Zion National Park, Utah



For a more adrenaline-pumping adventure, tackle the challenging hike to Angels Landing. This strenuous trail leads to a narrow ridge with sheer drop-offs on both sides. The views from the summit are incredible, but be sure to have a head for heights and good balance before attempting this hike.

3. The Wave, Coyote Buttes North, Arizona



This otherworldly landscape is a photographer's paradise. The Wave is a sandstone formation with swirling colors and intricate patterns. Permits are required to hike to this remote location, but the effort is worth it to witness this geological wonder.

4. The Enchantments, Washington



This alpine wonderland offers stunning views of jagged peaks, crystal-clear lakes, and lush meadows. The Enchantments permit system limits the number of hikers allowed on the trail each day, ensuring solitude and a pristine wilderness experience.

5. The Lost Coast Trail, California



Escape the crowds on this remote and rugged coastal trail that stretches for 25 miles along the Northern California coast. The trail offers stunning ocean views, towering sea cliffs, and the chance to spot marine wildlife.

6. The John Muir Trail, California



For a longer and more challenging adventure, embark on the John Muir Trail, a 211-mile backpacking trail that traverses the Sierra Nevada mountains. The trail passes through diverse landscapes, including alpine meadows, granite peaks, and ancient forests.

7. The Wonderland Trail, Mount Rainier National Park, Washington



This iconic trail circumnavigates the base of Mount Rainier, the tallest peak in the Cascade Range. The 93-mile loop trail offers breathtaking views of glaciers, waterfalls, and lush forests.

8. The Icefields Parkway, Alberta, Canada



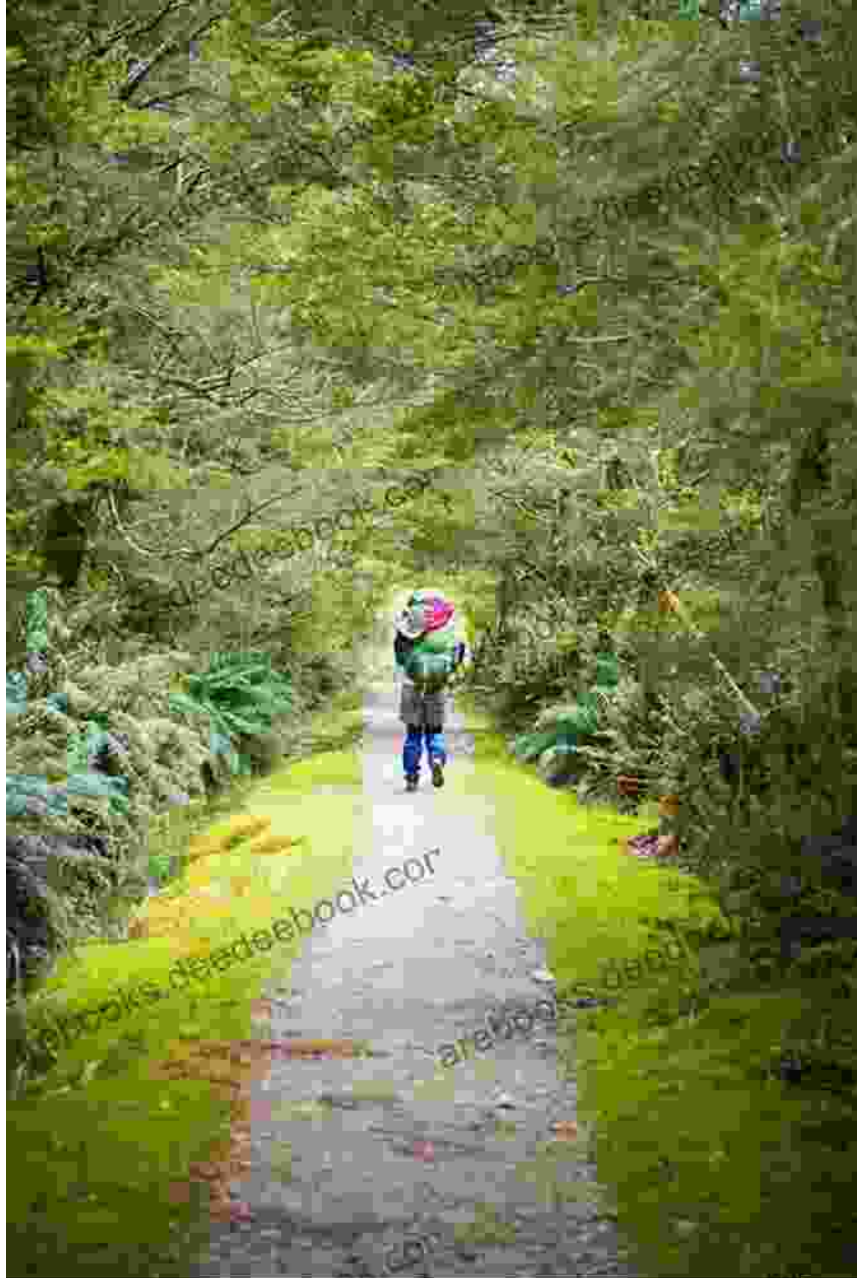

9. The Laugavegur Trail, Iceland

10. The Milford Track, New Zealand



Considered one of the most beautiful hikes in the world, the Milford Track offers stunning scenery with waterfalls, glaciers, and alpine meadows. The 33-mile trail is accessible only by boat or helicopter.
